

The Bracken Collection

This collection is comprised of three acid free boxes relating to the Brackin family of Nashville, TN and related families.

BOX 1 – Two bound manuscripts and 2 folders of loose papers:

1. The Line of Dr. Henry B. Brackin – Nashville, TN. Research by Mrs. Rachel Lucker Brackin and Mrs. Edythe R. Whitley. Compiled by Edythe R. Whitley, 1952-1957. Includes author correspondence.

2. Part 2 of above – Miscellaneous Genealogical Information on various branches of the Brackin family in America.

3 and 4. - Contains approximately 2000 pages (4 inches) of materials on Bracken and related families, each with detailed genealogical account of known members, birth and death dates, marriages, etc. with an index per family. CD with duplicate of harcopy material included and Table of Contents. BOX 3 – three 3-ring binders and one acid free folder
